

Well known and respected throughout the sanitary maintenance industry, Beckson has been an avid supporter of ISSA and an exhibitor at ISSA tradeshows since 1980, the year the firm joined the association.

In addition to their use for a wide variety of industrial requirements, Beckson pumps have unique applications in the dairy, irrigation, municipal, and petroleum markets—anywhere, in fact, that liquid transfer is required and electrical or mechanical pumps are neither available nor appropriate.

"The liquid-transfer markets insist upon a safe, quality product, particularly when dealing with the wide variety of chemicals in use today," says Beckson Industrial President Michael C. Brady.

Beckson—the name is taken from the founders' last names—expanded into the industrial markets in the 1960s, when it found that boat owners were bringing the Beckson pump back to their factories because the premium-quality PVC pumps worked so effectively with chemicals that attacked the standard metal pumps that were being used.
